



You know about His birth. You know about His death. But, what about His life? Jesus stepped into the world and split time in half, BC—AD. But, what about "the dash" in between?

Either through years of regular church attendance or more frequent attendance around Christmas and Easter, most of us are very familiar with the stories of Jesus' birth and death. We get a little fuzzy, though, on the details of His life. Yes, we know He performed many miracles like feeding 5,000 people and walking on water. We also know that He said profound things like "love your enemy" and "blessed are the meek." But, how do all those details connect? Why did He say and do the things He did? When and where did those events fall in His life and ministry? Was there any purpose or pattern to them? Or, were they just random events in the life of an unusually holy man?

These are the type of questions we will seek to answer as we go through "The Dash." We will uncover how Jesus lived, and even more importantly, what it means for you. This will be a journey of faith seeking understanding—understanding what happened, why it matters and how we should then live in response. The minor goal of this series will be to help us all gain a working knowledge of the historical, geographic and cultural factors that shaped Jesus' life and ministry. The major goal is that by better understanding Jesus, we can become more like Him.


Amazingly, Jesus' public ministry lasted only three years. Think of how He changed the world in such a short time. We will use those three years as a framework for learning about His life. First, we'll look at the "Years of Preparation," which happened before His three years of ministry. Then, we'll explore the subsequent three years in order. It's helpful to think of them as "The Year of Inauguration," The Year of Popularity," and finally "The Year of Opposition."

A Reading Guide will be available for anyone who wants to read ahead in the Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke and John—to prepare for the upcoming topic of the week. This guide will also be useful as a tool to enable us to see which stories from Jesus' life come from which Gospel and how the Gospels themselves are different from one another.

Of course, all adults are invited to deepen their understanding of what's presented in the worship service by joining in a discussion of the sermon in one of the FUN Groups that meet after worship. "The Dash" will begin Sunday, September 17. Come and discover how Jesus lived...and what it means for you!

## SESSION MEETING AUGUST 24 HIGHLIGHTS

Session continued to study "Becoming a Flourish Church" by learning about the particular roles of church members as defined in Ephesians 4 (apostle, prophet, evangelist, shepherd, teacher).

- Approved the Youth Ministry Team request to take a Youth Works mission trip to Cortez, CO in July 2018.
- Heard report from the Safety Team regarding progress made at its first meeting. Initial actions will focus on three areas: 1.) Sunday worship security by creating a plan for locking the main doors once worship begins. 2.) Nursery security. 3.) Video surveillance. Next meeting August 30.

- Heard a report from Pastor Jack on potential Covenant Partners. There are currently 57 adults, youth and children worshiping with us who are not Covenant Partners. Some need to be baptized and/or profess faith. The church has a responsibility to disciple all. A Covenant Class will be offered soon for any interested in joining the class through Covenant Partnership. Elders divided names of all potential Covenant Partners to pray regularly for them.

AND SOME BIG NEWS! We're heading west! YDOC will again go on a mission trip next summer through YouthWorks. This time, we will be going to Cortez, Colorado. Cortez is a large town about 1/3 the size of Wooster, and is the seat of Montezuma County, in the southwest corner of the state. Its economy is mainly tourism based, as it is situated between Mesa Verde National Park and the Canyons of the Ancients National Monument.

While there, we will be running Kids' Club (similar to VBS, but designed to go all summer) and completing work projects for the community and individuals (such as park cleanups, painting, yard work, gardening, etc.) as well as spending time learning about Native American culture from locals and visiting nearby Mesa Verde National Park.

We will be at the site from July 1st - 6th, but due to the drive time, we will be leaving June 29th and returning July 9th. The cost per person will be \$550. YDOC will host multiple fundraisers between now and next summer (meals, babysitting, etc), as well as helping youth to write letters to friends and family to ask for assistance in paying the fees. Don't let the cost keep you from going! We will be making every effort to make it as easy as possible to afford.

Signing up for the trip requires a \$25 deposit per person (or \$50/family) by Sunday, September 10th. While this is short notice, it is important to signup early, because this is allowing us to get tickets at a considerable discount due to a limited-time offer from Youth-Works.
